

CERTIFICATE IN GLOBAL HEALTH FOR ANTHROPOLOGY MAJORS AND ANTHROPOLOGY GRADUATE STUDENTS

The Certificate in Global Health was established as part of the Framework for Global Health Curricula, which is coordinated by the Center for Global Health and Diseases in the School of Medicine. The Certificate is intended to prepare both undergraduate and graduate students for continued involvement and potentially a career in global health. 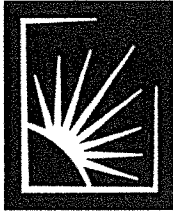
