## 2017-18 Ethics Table Fellow application and information

## The plan and the conditions

The fellows meet for the mornings of a week prior to class starts, August 21<sup>st</sup>-25<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The meetings begin at 9 AM and end at noon, with lunch (the room is reserved until 12:30 PM). During that week, the fellows collect as a group, read and discuss ethical and moral theory, and conceptualize the work for the semester.

The group then meets once per month for the academic year, over dinner. Attending these meetings 75% or more of the time is a condition on being a fellow.

In January, however, in lieu of a dinner, there is a day-long retreat at my home, from 10AM-4PM on a Saturday, with lunch included. Attending this is also a condition on being a fellow.

Finally, in May, the fellows decide on how to stage a public workshop for the CWRU community, usually over two, partial days. Presenting at that is also a condition on being a fellow.

## What fellows receive

Fellows receive a brush up or introductory exposure to ethical and moral theory. They receive sustained feedback and collegiality from other fellows and enter into a network of fellows dating back to 2011. They earn and receive an experience around their ethical or moral learning project and a place in our public to share it.

Fellows also receive in June of 2018, provided the conditions of the fellowship have been met, a stipend, fellowship or pay (depending on their category at CWRU) for approximately \$1200. Fellows also have access during the year to a small research fund, not to exceed \$500 per fellow, and an activity fund, not to exceed \$300 per fellow.

## The application

**Who can apply**: Any student, staff, administrative or faculty member at CWRU who has a proposal to affect the ethical or moral learning environment of the university.

**The project**: Any project that can reasonably be said to aim at affecting the ethical or moral learning environment of the university. It could be a course, a student organization, a policy change, a support group, or a piece of research that you expect to share and which directly considers ethics or morality.

- Your project proposal in *no less* than one full single spaced page and *no more* than two single spaced pages. Please be formal. These are subject to review.
